

FROM THE PASTOR



I hope you are all coping well with the winter weather. I also hope that you are encouraged to see the statistics on the spread of Covid-19 going back in the right direction here in NJ (down, that is).

Right now our <u>Capital Campaign</u> has reached a bit of a stall. As you have no doubt seen by the thermometer in the Narthex we have slightly over half our goal pledged at this point, some \$315,924.00. That, of course, is the pledged amount, not the actual amount of money we have so far received. To date we have received \$145, 310.00 paid to the parish.

At this point that is only about 1/3 of the amount that we would need to begin the work on repairing the classroom wing roof. In addition, we can't even begin to make plans yet because the contractor would need about 3 months lead time in order to start preparing to do the work. That long lag is primarily due to supply chain problems in obtaining materials.

The thing that is most concerning to me at this point is that the amount that has already been pledged has come from just <u>70 households</u> (one of the pledges is mine so I don't count myself and another is from one of my brothers so I'm not counting his household either).

We have far more that 70 households in this parish. So, that means that a significant number of you have not yet made a pledge to our campaign. I certainly hope that you will consider doing so. This parish belongs to all of us and all of us have to do our part to help maintain the facilities, participate in parish activities and assist all those in need. This isn't something that it is "OK" to let others shoulder the burden for. **We must all pitch in.**

So, please, make a pledge. It is a three year campaign and we are only half way there so far in terms of pledges. We're only a little over 1/6 of the way there in terms of what we have raised. We took a break for the holidays but now we are asking you earnestly to help us to reach our goal.

To those of you who have pledged and/or have begun to make payments on those pledges: **THANK YOU!**
