FROM THE PASTOR



It's almost hard to believe that we are entering the last full week of January already. The month is just flying by. This year we have a bit of a break in the liturgical action before Lent begins but before we know it we'll be into that

season too and talking about the approach of Easter.

On <u>Wednesday, February 2</u> the Church celebrates the *Feast of the Presentation of the Lord.* This day is also known as "Candlemas Day". It commemorates the time that the child Jesus was presented in the Temple by His parents. A prophetess who saw Him said He would be a "Light to the Nations and the glory of Israel". Because of that image of light the Church blesses candles on that day. If you have candles that you would like to have blessed for your own use then you may feel free to bring them to Mass that day and have them blessed.

It is customary to keep blessed candles in the house in order to have one lit if/when a priest comes to visit the sick and also to light during an oncoming storm as a symbol of prayer against danger or damage.

Now that the holidays are well and truly over I hope that those of you who have not yet made a pledge to the <u>Parish</u> <u>Capital Campaign</u> will consider doing so. My sincere thanks to all of you who have made a pledge and to those who have already begun to make payments toward that pledge. As of now we have only slightly more than half our goal pledged. However, that amount of pledged money comes from fewer than one quarter of the active households in the parish. Please think about that: *fewer than a quarter of the parishioners have already pledged just over half the money to get us to our goal.*

Our goal will be easily achieved if everyone participates.

In addition, to those of you who have made "one time" gifts to the appeal: Thank You. However, it is my hope that you will consider making a contribution during all three years of the campaign. We started the campaign last November and it will run until at least November of 2024.

It is vital that as many people as possible take part and share in the burden of achieving the goal. The parish serves all of us; we <u>all</u> must do our part to ensure its continued existence, vitality and growth.

I hope the week ahead is one that will be filled with blessings and have few problems or worries. Please continue to be safe and healthy and, above all, Keep the Faith!
