SAVE THE DATE!


Two events in the parish that are coming up are worth putting on your calendar now so that you can plan to be here and share in them.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

A reminder that in order to receive Holy Communion worthily and in a state of proper preparedness <u>it is required</u> that we fast from all food and drink for one hour prior to receiving Holy Communion. Water is an exception to that and also so is medication.

However, breath mints, hard candy, and chewing gum violate the Communion fast! You may not be chewing gum during Mass, or sucking on a piece of candy or a breath mint and then also come forward to receive Holy Communion. If you inadvertently break the fast (by chewing gum, for example) and realize it after Mass has begun you should not receive at that Mass. Don't just dismiss it and think, "Oh well, I didn't mean to do it so it doesn't matter."

It matters.

The regulations used to be that in order to receive one had to fast from Midnight the night before. Now, the rule is that you have to fast for just one hour. This is an easy rule with which to comply. All it requires is that you be mindful of what you are doing and also have proper respect for the Furcharist

Remember: receiving Communion is <u>not</u> your right; it is a gift and a privilege!

FROM THE PASTOR



This week the Church remembers St. Benedict on July 11. He's a saint close to my heart because of the years I spent as a Benedictine monk before I was ordained. St. Benedict is considered the "Patriarch of Western Monasticism". His

Holy Rule is a classic work of spirituality that has not only guided the monks and nuns who follow St. Benedict to this day but also countless lay people who are Benedictine Oblates or just simply find his insights helpful. In our own time, the Benedictine monks and nuns, Cistercians of the Common Observance, Cistercians of the Strict Observance (more commonly known as "Trappists"), Camaldolese, Olivetan, Sylvestrine, and Vallombrosian monastic orders follow the Rule of St. Benedict.

Here in the parish things will be rather quiet. In these summer months there isn't usually much going on. Later this week I'll be away for a few days. I'm off to Pittsburgh to visit with some dear friends from my college days. This trip had been an annual event for the last few years but the pandemic put a stop to that temporarily. So, this will be the first trip I've taken in about two years. I'll be back next week. Say a prayer for me while I'm gone. I will certainly be remembering all of you in my prayers.
