

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

A reminder that in order to receive Holy Communion worthily and in a state of proper preparedness <u>it is required</u> <u>that we fast from all food and drink for one hour prior to</u> <u>receiving Holy Communion</u>. Water is an exception to that and also so is medication.

However, breath mints, hard candy, and chewing gum violate the Communion fast! You may not be chewing gum during Mass, or sucking on a piece of candy or a breath mint and then also come forward to receive Holy Communion. If you inadvertently break the fast (by chewing gum, for example) and realize it after Mass has begun you should not receive at that Mass. Don't just dismiss it and think, "Oh well, I didn't mean to do it so it doesn't matter."

It matters.

The regulations used to be that in order to receive one had to fast from Midnight the night before. Now, the rule is that you have to fast for just one hour. This is an easy rule with which to comply. All it requires is that you be mindful of what you are doing and also have proper respect for the Eucharist.

Remember: receiving Communion is <u>not</u> your right; it is a gift and a privilege!

FROM THE PASTOR

As we go on searching in this great land of freedom, justice and regard for the less fortunate, we always strive to make that search one which includes all people and invites all people to come to know the true peace that can be found in Christ.
