

FROM THE PASTOR



"Come, Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in us the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and we shall be created; and You shall renew the face of the Earth!"

These ancient words invoke the grace, the comfort and the fire of the Holy Spirit as we celebrate His descent upon the apostles and Our Lady on what is considered to be the "birthday" of the Church: Pentecost.

There is an ancient hymn —sung or recited at Masses on Pentecost Sunday— called the <u>Pentecost Sequence</u> which says:

Come, Holy Spirit, come. And from your celestial home shed a ray of light divine. Come, Father of the poor. Come, source of all our store. Come, within our bosoms shine.

You, of comforters the best; You, the soul's most welcome guest; sweet refreshment here below; in our labor, rest most sweet; grateful coolness in the heat; solace in the midst of woe.

O most blessed Light divine, shine within these hearts of yours, and our inmost being fill. Where you are not, we have naught, nothing good in deed or thought, Nothing free from taint of ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; on our dryness pour your dew; wash the stains of guilt away:

Bend the stubborn heart and will; melt the frozen, warm the chill; guide the steps that go astray. On the faithful, who adore and confess you, evermore in your sevenfold gift descend; give them virtue's sure reward; give them your salvation, Lord; give them joys that never end.

Amen. Alleluia.

The Lord, Father and Son, send Their Holy Spirit upon us to act as comforter, guardian, teacher and the One who inspires us and prompts us ever onward to do good works in the world as a means of giving witness to our faith in the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

I pray that the Holy Spirit will once again come upon you and fill you with every grace and all spiritual blessings. May He strengthen you to remain steadfast in your faith in a world that often challenges the faith and makes it increasingly difficult to have courage and peace. We do live in turbulent times. But, the Holy Spirit —the Comforter and Advocate— is among us and will never abandon us.
