MARCH MADNESS BRACKET CHALLENGE

After a two-year hiatus, the KofC March Madness Bracket Challenge is back. Entries are \$10 and the proceeds will benefit the Ukraine Solidarity Fund.

All entries must be received prior to March 16. You can pay for your entry after weekend Masses or via Paypal.

FROM THE PASTOR



St. Joseph Day is coming!!

Now, I know that for most of you March is all about St. Patrick's Day. And, sadly, for the third year in a row we are not having our Parish Irish Night due to the

pandemic. However, just a couple of days after St. Patrick's Day is St. Joseph Day.

He is the patron saint of the Universal Church as well as being the patron saint of our parish. His feast day is a solemnity —the highest of five kinds of feast days in the Church— and ranking greatest in significance. (By comparison, St. Patrick's day is the second to lowest kind of liturgical day, an optional memorial!)

This year, St. Joseph Day, March 19, has special significance. It marks 150 years to the day since the first Mass was celebrated in our parish. After the parish had been erected by Bishop James Roosevelt Bayley of Newark late in 1871 it took some time to get things organized. It was on St. Joseph Day, 1872 that the newly formed parish of St. Joseph had a celebration of the Eucharist for the first time and has continued to do so every day since then for one hundred and fifty years.

On <u>Saturday</u>, <u>March 19</u> we will have a special St. Joseph Day Mass at 11:00AM in the church. Then, that evening from 5:00 - 7:00 PM in the Parish Center the Knights of Columbus will be hosting a <u>free</u> family pasta dinner. It is requested that you sign up in advance to come to the dinner. You can do so by using the sign-up list in the Narthex of church -OR- by going to <u>www.council5170.org</u> to sign up online.

I hope that as many of you as are able will join us in church at Mass that morning to celebrate our parish's patron saint and to celebrate 150 years of Sacramental life here in Washington. I hope lots of you will also join us that evening for the dinner. You could come to 5:00 PM Mass and then just stick around to enjoy dinner as well!
