

FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! He has Ascended! Alleluia!

We celebrate the <u>Solemnity of the</u> <u>Ascension of the Lord</u> and the

Christ returns to the Father from whom He came and we then await the coming of the Holy Spirit.

Because the Governor of New Jersey has relaxed the restrictions on gatherings we received some new instructions from the diocese. I am happy to say that as of <u>May 19</u> there are no longer any restrictions on the number of people attending houses of worship in New Jersey. Accordingly we will make some changes in the way we are celebrating Sunday Masses to take effect next weekend, <u>May 22 & 23</u>:

The pews will no longer be restricted *EXCEPT* one of the four sections of pews will still have every other pew blocked off for those who are still wary of sitting to close to others. The rest of the pews will be open. <u>Everyone attending Mass must still wear face masks, use hand sanitizer upon entering church and try to keep some distance from each other as much as possible.</u>

Holy Communion will once again be distributed at the normal time in the Mass. For the time being we are not restoring Communion under both species.

For the present we are not restoring Holy Water to the holy water stoups.

We will have music at all the Masses, the choir will be returned to Mass and the hymnals and missalettes will be returned to the pews. In June we will again begin to use all the liturgical ministries of altar servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of Communion and ushers.

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect until you are advised otherwise. Consequently, the Saturday 5:00PM Mass will continue to be live-streamed until the dispensation is lifted.

This is still not a full return to "normal" but I hope that it will be seen as more progress in that direction. I hope it also encourages more people to come to Mass in person. We can still be careful and be together.

May the Risen Christ continue to bless you and yours with His grace and His peace. May the celebration of the Lord's Ascension remind us that from His place in heaven the Lord is always with us still through all our struggles.

He is Truly Risen & Ascended! Alleluia!
