FROM THE PASTOR



Long Live the King!

This last Sunday of the liturgical calendar is always kept as the Solemnity of Christ, the King of the Universe. As we get to the end of the

Church's year we are thinking about the end times. This solemnity serves as a reminder that Christ promised He would return at the ending of the world and that all creation would see Him as Messiah and King. That means the end of the world—something most people dread—isn't really something for us to be frightened about.

The Kingdom of God, which is already within you by virtue of Baptism, will reach its fulfillment. The true existence that God always wanted for His creation will finally come about. It is true that it means all we now know will pass away but that is scary only if we are too attached to this world and to the things of this world.

If we have striven to live our lives in obedience to what Jesus taught us then the prospect of this world passing away and the fullness of God's kingdom coming to fruition should fill us with a sense of anticipation and joy, not dread and fear.

I know, too, that what follows the return of Christ, the King is final judgement. Once again, judgement is only something to truly fear if we have lived bad lives. For those who, sinful though they may be, try and with perseverance strive towards living a good and virtuous life, then judgement will be just but not terrifying. At least that's how it should be. We have every opportunity here and now to live as Christ taught. Don't waste it.

So much attention this year has been focused on the coming of a new king to the United Kingdom. The passing of Queen Elizabeth II truly marked the end of an era. Her death was of great historical significance even for those of us who are not subjects of the British Crown. The cries of "God Save the King!" regarding King Charles remind us all that God does not have to save our king because Christ is our true Lord and King.

As King Charles grows accustomed to his new role as a symbol of his nation and a kind of father-figure to his country we keep this feast to remember that our King is no mere figurehead or symbol. We are reminded that our God is not a "father-figure" but truly our Father, the Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifer of all that is. We can cry, "Long Live the King!" because we desire Christ to live in our hearts and minds; to dwell in our lives and our homes; to rule over us now and always. Give yourself completely to Him. No matter what causes you fear or concern give it over entirely to Him, your true Lord and King.

Have a great week ahead. I hope the Lord touches your lives and those of the ones you love with abundant blessings. May you feel His love surrounding you. Remember, above all things, to Keep The Faith!
