This is coming up and worth putting on your calendar now so that you can plan to be here and share in it.



It is also my sad duty to inform you that Deacon Sylvan Webb will be leaving our parish. Deacon Sylvan has served as a Permanent Deacon in our Diocese for fifteen years and has been a parishioner here for far longer. Most of you are probably aware that Deacon Sylvan and his wife, Lorna moved last year to Whitehouse Station, NJ.

At the time he was making the move he and I discussed whether or not he would stay on here or transfer his ministry to Our Lady of Lourdes in Whitehouse Station. He indicated to me that he desired to continue ministry here and that he was willing to make the commute in order to do so. I assured him that was fine with me. We wouldn't lose his ministry and if circumstances ever changed he could always make that decision later.

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 20</u>, <u>2022</u> at the 11:00 Mass Deacon Sylvan will serve at a parish Mass for the last time and we will all have the opportunity to offer him our thanks and our good wishes. Mass that day will be followed by coffee in the Narthex of the church sponsored by the Rosary Altar Society. I hope as many of you as possible will attend the 11:00 Mass that day.
