
SAVE THE DATE!

FROM THE PASTOR



Recently, a number of people have commented to me that they thought the parish grounds were looking pretty good. Things are in better repair and the grounds are in somewhat better shape than in the previous two years. They also

commented on how things look nice around the church itself and they wanted to thank me for taking care of all this.

Well, don't thank me! I actually have very little to do with it. Yes, I'll admit that as the Pastor I am "in charge" of everything that happens around here and it usually involves me signing off on something.

However, there are a lot of other people involved in this. For example, the recent renovation and refurbishment of the pedestal and statue of St. Joseph in front of the church was due to the initiative and generosity of the Knights of Columbus.

Similarly, it was a member of the Knights of Columbus who asked the contractor who refurbished the pedestal to take a look at the front walkway at the entrance to the Rectory. That's how I found someone to do the recent work there to replace the entire front entrance.

Hummel Landscaping services provide all the landscaping on our property and they also take care of the cemetery, including doing the grave-digging. This year we also hired a separate person to spray for weeds and help us stay ahead of all the weed growth that happens so easily in the summer.

The Finnegan's — Lori and Terry — give of their time and their effort to provide the planting and maintaining of the flowers and small plants that are in the planters and along the walkways outside of our church. They do that on their own initiative and provide all that labor as a service to their parish for which we are very grateful.

So, yes, it may be true that all such activity takes place here on the property with my knowledge and my permission. But, as you can see, it really isn't my doing. Trying to maintain a large piece of property like this one requires the efforts of many people. Some of them are paid for their work as is only right. Some do it as a donation to the parish to help keep up and beautify the church property for all who come here.

That's part of the essence of a parish: it is a family; a place where people pitch in as a group. The parish is not just the "Sacrament Store" where you come to consume religious goods and services.
