BISHOP'S APPEAL

Our Bishop's Annual Appeal Goal this year is once again \$28,000.00. So far, this year, as of August 11, our parish has pledged \$18,017.60 which represents 64.35% of our goal.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

According to information received this past week from Giving Trend, the company administering our Capital Campaign the total amount pledged to the campaign as of August 10 is: \$450,990.71. The total amount that has been paid is: \$353,399.71.

Our goal is to reach \$600,000. So far expenses (including Giving Trend fees, last year's Bishop's Appeal goal and replacement of the Parish Center HVAC units) amounted to \$123,398.00. That means our adjusted cash-on-hand is: \$230,001.71.

FROM THE PASTOR



I am now beginning my last full week as your Pastor. Next <u>Sunday</u>, <u>August 27</u>, will be my final Sunday in the parish. I move to South Amboy the next day. After the 11:00 am Mass next Sunday there will be a light reception in the Parish Center Bingo Hall so that I will have the

opportunity to say farewell to parishioners. Regardless of what Mass you attend I hope as many of you as possible will make the effort to come to the reception and say goodbye.

This coming <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>August 22</u>, is the <u>Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary</u>, or sometimes referred to as the <u>Feast of Our Lady</u>, <u>Mother and Queen</u>. This day which is a memorial for the rest of the Church, is a feast here in the Diocese of Metuchen because it is the patronal feast of the Diocese. After St. John Paul II established the diocese he allowed its first bishop to choose a special patron for the new diocese and Mary, Our Queen was chosen. If you look at the diocesan coat of arms (which you can easily see on one of the two huge banners hanging on the back wall of our church) you will see it contains the letter "M" with a crown on top. Many people mistakenly think the "M" stands for Metuchen. In fact, it is a symbol of the Queenship of Mary.

This feast used to be in May but Pope Pius XII moved the observance of the feast to the octave day of the Assumption, <u>August 22</u>. So, it often gets overlooked because it falls in vacation season but it is actually a beautiful celebration that relates to Mary's Assumption by celebrating her coronation as the Queen of Heaven (the fifth and final of the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary).

Mary, the Mother of the Church, reigns above as the Queen of Heaven where she intercedes with God on behalf of all her earthly children. It is a feast that reminds us that Mary is always attentive to our needs and the prayers of our hearts. In addition, it reminds us that she will always take those needs and lay them at the feet of the Lord on our behalf.

On Tuesday remember to offer a prayer for all the people, clergy and parishes of our Diocese. Let us all echo the words of the well-known hymn: Hail! Holy Queen enthroned above, O Maria! Hail, mother of mercy and of love, O Maria! ...heaven and earth resound the hymn: Salve, Regina!

I hope this week ahead—my final one as your Pastor—is filled with nothing but blessings and good things. Remember to take some time to thank God for all the good things in your life and to ask for His help with whatever may be going not so well. This is that part of the summer when everyone begins to think about "vacation time" ending and getting geared up for the season ahead. Just leave a little room in there for the Holy Spirit as well. Remember, above all, to Keep The Faith!
