FROM THE PASTOR



It is, as always, good to be home. Travel is always a fun experience, even with the inconveniences associated with air travel these days. I consider my self very blessed that I have the opportunity to travel occasionally. I am very well aware that it is an experience that not everyone

gets to have and I never take it for granted.

Italy was...well, what can I say? Italy is Italy! The scenery, the kind people, the history and, of course, the **food**! On my father's side I am Italian. Both of my paternal grandparents were born in Italy. In fact, our name was originally "Silvestri" before they emigrated to the U.S. and changed it to Selvester to sound "more American". So, going to Italy always feels like a homecoming of sorts to me. It is a place deeply rooted in my heart. BUT...as I say, it is good to be home!

This week in Matthew's gospel we hear a challenging message. We are asked to take what has been handed to us in the form of the Commandments and to strive to obey them but not by doing the minimum. We are asked to surpass them. This is partly because Jesus wasn't just interested in the mere observance of the law. He had come into the world to take God's people to the next level. In the gospel today we hear Jesus presenting that challenge to "level up' to His disciples (and to us!).

This is part of what we mean when we say we want to keep the faith. It's not that the faith is some static thing that must be preserved untouched like a precious jewel. We can't lock it away in the hopes that it will remain undisturbed. Our faith is a living thing and it must be used, and lived, and expanded. Each and every day of our lives we must strive to help our faith grow and flourish. That can't be done if we see it merely as the observance of rules and guidelines.

Rather, we must look deeper to what the rules really mean. Why are they in place? What are they designed to accomplish? Where are they leading us? Once we know that then we can take it upon ourselves to go the extra mile. If we know our ultimate goal then why hold back on the way? Instead we should look to be running toward that goal and giving more and more of ourselves to accomplish our task. We have to know and understand the Commandments and then blow past them into an even greater effort to live the faith that has been handed on to us.

Now, it's not easy! No one says that it is. In fact, what Christ calls us to is extremely challenging and difficult. Nevertheless, it is our calling. We can accomplish far more than we might ever imagine with the help of God's grace.

As the week ahead unfolds before you be mindful of that. There are difficulties to be sure but with God's help we can overcome any difficulty. I hope the week affords you many blessings. Remember above all to Keep The Faith!
