FROM THE PASTOR



After quite some time I am finally getting the chance to go away on vacation. Like everyone else in the world travel was impossible for me during the pandemic. Even as that started to be less of a problem I just wasn't comfortable with the

iuea οι τιανεί. 50, while I used to take a couple of trips each year I haven't traveled in some time.

I was very fortunate that my mother decided to move from California back to the east coast. So, that eliminated one of the really big trips I used to take every year. I was in the habit of flying to California for Thanksgiving each year. Now, I no longer need to do that. I can see my mother on Long Island with just a car ride.

The last time I traveled was in February, 2020 when I visited Catania, Sicily for the great Feast of St. Agatha which takes place February 2-6. This is one of the largest religious festivals in the world and it is the largest in Europe. The whole city turns out in honor of their patron saint, St. Agatha, who is credited by the citizens with sparing the city by her intervention from the eruption of Mt. Ætna, the most active volcano on the European continent.

In 2004 I became a Chaplain in the Order of the Collar of Saint Agatha of Paternò which is headquartered in Catania. So, just like my last overseas trip, I will once again be returning to Catania for the Festa di Sant'Agata. While the trip will be relaxing and fun it is also for a religious festival. So, I will remember to pray for all of you and your intentions while I am there. On the way home I will be stopping in Rome for a few days as well. I hope to have the chance to pray at the tomb of Pope Benedict XVI who recently passed away.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE: while I am away the weekend Masses will continue as usual and there will also be Mass on Monday, February 6. However, on all the other weekdays between February 1 and February 10 there will be no daily Mass each morning.

Those of you who wish to attend a daily Mass on those days there is a daily Mass (M-F) at 8:00am at St. Ann in Hampton, a daily Mass at St. Theodore in Port Murray on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday at 8:45am and daily Mass (M-F) at the Blue Army Shrine at 12:00 noon.

I have also been summoned for Jury Duty (yay!) With any luck, I will be excused as I was the last time this happened. But, if I am not I will have to serve for at least five days starting February 10. I won't know if I am excused until February 9. I'll keep you posted!
