BISHOP'S APPEAL

Our Bishop's Annual Appeal Goal this year is once again \$28,000.00. So far, this year, as of July 7, our parish has pledged **\$16,992.60** which represents **60.69%** of our goal. So far there have been 87 individual donations made.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

According to information received this past week from Giving Trend, the company administering our Capital Campaign the total amount pledged to the campaign as of June 23 is: \$443,612.00. The total amount that has been paid is: \$340,235.00.

Our goal is to reach \$600,000. So far expenses (including Giving Trend fees, last year's Bishop's Appeal goal and replacement of the Parish Center HVAC units) amounted to \$*122,858.00*. That means our adjusted cash-on-hand is: **\$217,377.00**.

FROM THE PASTOR



This coming week the Church celebrates a saint who played a major role in the story of our salvation but who continues to be maligned because of misinformation. On <u>Saturday, July 22</u> the Church keeps the feast of St. Mary Magdalen.

This woman was a contemporary of Jesus and, indeed, one of His followers. She had been profoundly affected by His teachings and His presence and she devoted herself to following Him. In fact, it was Mary Magdalen who went to the tomb early in the morning on the Sunday after Jesus died to visit his grave. She was the first to see Him risen from the dead. Jesus entrusted her with going and telling the disciples that He had risen. Jesus sent her on a mission. The word apostle means "one sent on a mission". So, in a very real way her mission—her apostolate— was to proclaim the resurrection to the world. For this she is called "the apostle to the apostles".

But, everyone thinks she was a prostitute.

There is positively **no** evidence whatsoever to support the idea that Mary Magdalene was a prostitute. <u>None!</u> All that the Scriptures say is that she had been a very sinful woman. That could mean almost anything. It does not imply she was a prostitute and her becoming a follower of Jesus reformed her. Some question whether or not Mary Magdalen may have been the woman caught in adultery that Jesus saved from stoning. That may possibly be so but, again, adultery is not the same thing as prostitution.

Yet, this calumny has been repeated and repeated throughout the centuries to the point that many people, perhaps even most people, assume that it's true, *but it isn't true*.

Thanks to people like Dan Brown with his well-read book <u>The DaVinci Code</u> there are lots of people who think that Mary Magdalen was the wife, or worse yet, merely the lover of Jesus. After all, how could a man and a woman have a close relationship without it becoming romantic or physical, right? That kind of wrong-headed, unthinking nonsense serves no good purpose in the Church, or in the world.

Mary Magdalen was a sinner who converted from a life of sin because of Christ. In that she is just like all of you, and me, and everyone else in the Church: a poor sinner seeking redemption and salvation through Jesus Christ. Don't embellish what she was to make it "racier" and **STOP** believing things about our faith that don't come from a reliable source.

I hope you all have a blessed week ahead of you filled with good things and peace. Even though it is summer don't take a vacation from church. God doesn't take a vacation from *YOU*. Above all things, wherever you may be or whatever you might be doing remember to **Keep The Faith!**
