BISHOP'S APPEAL

Our Bishop's Annual Appeal Goal this year is once again \$28,000.00. So far, this year, as of June 23, our parish has pledged **\$16,792.60** which represents **59.97%** of our goal. So far there have been 86 individual donations made.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

According to information received this past week from Giving Trend, the company administering our Capital Campaign the total amount pledged to the campaign as of June 23 is: \$443,612.00. The total amount that has been paid is: \$340,235.00.

Our goal is to reach \$600,000. So far expenses (including Giving Trend fees, last year's Bishop's Appeal goal and replacement of the Parish Center HVAC units) amounted to \$*122,858.00*. That means our adjusted cash-on-hand is: **\$217,377.00**.

COMMUNAL THANKSGIVING AT MASS

As part of the ongoing effort to effect a revival of Eucharistic devotion we will observe a period of silent reflection after Communion at all Masses. This is a moment for everyone to make a personal thanksgiving after Communion and to reflect on the awesome Mystery of the Eucharist we have just received. Then we will recite together a communal thanksgiving by praying the prayer written by St. Thomas Aquinas known as "O Sacrum Convivium" (O Sacred Banquet) which goes:

"O sacred banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of His Passion is renewed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us."

After that we will have the Prayer After Communion followed by the announcements and then the blessing and dismissal. This practice will continue at every Mass until further notice.

FROM THE PASTOR



We have a Pastor! As you are all surely aware by now Bishop Checchio announced last weekend that he has appointed **Fr. James Kyrpczak** to be my successor as the 24th Pastor of St. Joseph Church, Washington. This is good news indeed and comes at the end

of several months of anxious waiting and anticipation.

Fr. James is a native of Hunterdon County having been raised in nearby Hampton, NJ. After studies at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia he was ordained to the priesthood by the late Bishop Edward Hughes in May of 1996. He brings with him a wealth of pastoral experience having served in several parishes of our diocese. During my brief assignment at Our Lady of Peace in Fords, NJ for several months in 2001-2002 Fr. James and I served together as Parochial Vicars in that parish.

Since 2018, Fr. James (as he prefers to be called) has served as the Administrator of St. Joseph Church in High Bridge. With Father's transfer to Washington, the High Bridge parish will be twinned with St. John Neumann in Califon and those two small parishes will be jointly served by a single pastor (just like the arrangement for St. Rose in Oxford twinned with St. Patrick in Belvidere).

I hope you all make Fr. James as welcome here as you have made me in these last eight years. Knowing you as I do I am certain that you will.

Last weekend the Bishop also ended the speculation about where I would be going by appointing me as the Pastor of **St. Mary Church in South Amboy, NJ**. The original patronal designation of that parish is St. Mary, Star of the Sea because of its close proximity to the water. Last January when I spoke with the Bishop about how my term as Pastor was ending in 2023 I indicated to him an openness to being moved further east in the diocese so that I could be closer to Long Island where my family live since it would make visiting them easier.

Unexpectedly, the Pastor at St. Mary, who has been there for 29 years, requested to retire this year and so the parish came open. I saw this as Providential. You can't go any further east than South Amboy or you'll be in Raritan Bay! I believe God was answering a prayer of mine. So, the chance to request assignment at St. Mary arose and, just as I requested to be assigned here eight years ago, I asked the Bishop to be assigned to South Amboy and he said yes.

Sometimes when you need it the most, God sees to it that all the circumstances come together so that everything can work out. I pray that such blessings come to you and yours as well, now and in the future.

These new appointments are effective September 1.

In the mean time have a blessed week ahead and remember, above all things, to Keep The Faith!
