### **COMMUNAL THANKSGIVING AT MASS**

After that we will have the Prayer After Communion followed by the announcements and then the blessing and dismissal. This practice will continue at every Mass until further notice.



# FROM THE PASTOR



Greetings from beautiful Vienna, Austria!

I find myself here on vacation and to attend an investiture for the *Military Order of the Collar of St. Agatha* which I serve as a chaplain. That's why I haven't

been around and that, other than Mondays, there have been no daily Masses. By next weekend I will be back again. I hope that many of you also have the chance for some vacation time this year. I know that not everyone does all the time. I try never to take my opportunities to get away for granted. The restorative effects of some time away can be very beneficial.

I want to take a moment to say a sincere word of <u>thanks</u> for the participation of so many people in the two big events we had here last weekend. The Parish Center Clean-Up was a resounding success. Approximately 30 people showed up to help out and a very large portion of the unneeded junk we had in the building accumulating for years has now been disposed of. I am very grateful for the time and hard work of so many!

In addition, a word of <u>thanks</u> to those of you who spent some time in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament on Corpus Christi. There were numerous people here all during the three hours adoration and quite a few who came, or stayed, for Benediction. While on one day we had a very practical and hands-on event in the Parish Center clean up we then followed that with a purely spiritual event in adoration and Benediction. Our parish endeavors to do both kinds of things and, while I am biased, I think we have gotten very good at each. So, thanks for your participation. Between the weekly rosary for the Eucharistic Revival we had in May and this period of adoration on Corpus Christi I think our parish is making a good effort to help the Church-wide Eucharistic revival.

Six years ago I was appointed as Pastor of this parish in a letter from the Bishop dated <u>June 17</u>. That was, of course, after serving two years as Administrator first. So, technically my term as Pastor "expired" on <u>June 17</u>. However, that word is in quotes because the Bishop, when he informed me that I would be moving this year, also told me that he was instructing me to stay on here as Pastor until such time as I was legitimately reassigned. That is—as of this writing—still to occur. So, it is a minute canonical technicality that my term is up but it has been extended by the Bishop on his authority until I actually move and a successor is put in place here to come after me.

I hope that the week ahead is one that is filled with blessings. Please pray for me while I am away, especially that I will be safe and return safely home. Be assured that in several of the beautiful churches of Vienna I am remembering you and your loved ones in my prayers. Remember that no matter what lies ahead, above all, to Keep The Faith!
