BISHOP'S APPEAL

Our Bishop's Annual Appeal Goal this year is once again \$28,000.00. So far, this year, as of June 16, our parish has pledged \$16,792.60 which represents 59.97% of our goal. So far there have been 86 individual donations made.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

According to information received this past week from Giving Trend, the company administering our Capital Campaign the total amount pledged to the campaign as of June 19 is: \$432,462.00. The total amount that has been paid is: \$333,725.00.

Our goal is to reach \$600,000. So far expenses (including Giving Trend fees, last year's Bishop's Appeal goal and replacement of the Parish Center HVAC units) amounted to \$122,858.00. That means our adjusted cash-on-hand is: \$210,867.00.





COMMUNAL THANKSGIVING AT MASS

As part of the ongoing effort to effect a revival of Eucharistic devotion we will observe a period of silent reflection after Communion at all Masses. This is a moment for everyone to make a personal thanksgiving after Communion and to reflect on the awesome Mystery of the Eucharist we have just received. Then we will recite together a communal thanksgiving by praying the prayer written by St. Thomas Aquinas known as "O Sacrum Convivium" (O Sacred Banquet) which goes:

"O sacred banquet, in which Christ is received, the memory of His Passion is renewed, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us."

After that we will have the Prayer After Communion followed by the announcements and then the blessing and dismissal. This practice will continue at every Mass until further notice.

FROM THE PASTOR



It's very good to be home! Last Sunday, I had the chance to concelebrate Mass in the great St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna (the Stephansdom) which was built in the 12th C. (see the photos on Facebook). It was a great experience but I missed seeing all of you. I'm at an age

now when it feels funny not to be in my own parish church on a Sunday morning. No matter how exotic or magnificent the setting I may be in, it never quite feels the same as being in my own church. So, I thought of all of you and prayed for you.

I think the experience of traveling is wonderful but that same kind of longing for home seems always to overtake me when I go away. When I was younger I loved traveling and always wanted it to last longer. Now, the feelings are different. Travel expands your horizons. It opens you up to new vistas; exposes you to new customs; teaches you about someone else's history and even delights the pallet with different foods. (For example: when I travel in Europe I refuse to go into a McDonalds. Why go all the way across the world and eat something I can get on Route 31??)

I also find, however, that travel away from home shakes you up a little because it removes you from what is comfortable and routine. It forces you to see things and people in a different way and, hopefully, it also prompts you to reassess and re-appreciate what you are temporarily deprived of back at home. I think the whole experience should move you to look at your own life, and ways of doing things, in order to value them more. Maybe it will even jolt you into changing what you "normally" do a little bit in light of some of your new experiences.

The same is also true of the spiritual life. We get into ruts. We pursue our spiritual lives by doing the same things in the same way at the same time over and over. It's not hard to see that eventually this will become boring. It is then a short step to simply dropping it altogether. Maybe a better method would be to "travel" to new vistas and new experiences? Change the way you do things in your spiritual life a bit. Try a new kind of prayer. Go to some kind of spiritual or liturgical offering that you've never been to before. Heck! It might even be something as simple as going to a different Mass some weekend, or (God-forbid!) sitting in a different seat! Whatever it might be for you, don't hesitate to try different things in your spiritual journey. Repetition ad nauseam leads to stagnation and that kills faith. So-go on a trip! (spiritually speaking). I am convinced it will do a lot to inject new life into your own spirituality.

I hope the week ahead—in this first week of summer (ugh!)—is one that is filled with many blessings and spiritual gifts for you and your families. Enjoy the beautiful weather and have lots of fun. Take some time to slow down and relax even if you never leave your own back yard. But, remember, above all to Keep The Faith!
