



FROM THE PASTOR



Father Guy Selvester, who has led your parish since 2015, has indicated to Bishop Checchio an openness to a different assignment since his six-year term as Pastor of Saint Joseph comes to an end in June this year. The Bishop has agreed so Father will step down as your

Pastor this summer, and another priest will be appointed to lead your parish community around the end of August.

Pastors are appointed by the bishop to lead local parishes and give them pastoral care. They share in the bishop's ministry of teaching, sanctifying, and governing. With the bishop's mandate, the pastor has full responsibility for shepherding the local church community.

To facilitate the appointment of a successor to Father Selvester, Bishop Checchio has initiated a consultation process to elicit input from your entire parish community, including clergy, staff, and all parishioners to determine what is hoped for in its new Pastor. This consultation process includes meetings with both parish staff and interested parishioners.

The meetings for parishioners will be held on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>March 23</u>, at 2:00 PM and 7:00 PM in your Church. These general meetings will be facilitated by Rev. Msgr. John Fell, Director of Priest Personnel. Members of the Pastoral and Finance Councils, Trustees, and all parishioners are invited and encouraged to participate.

Through these guided listening sessions, information will be gathered from parishioners that will assist the Bishop and Priest Personnel Board to better understand the parish's current status and needs. It must be clearly understood that this is a listening session **only**, and that the information gathered at this meeting will be one factor among many which the Priest Personnel Board will consider in recommending candidates and the Bishop will consider in ultimately choosing the next pastor of St. Joseph. This consultation is not to solicit the names of individual priests, and these will not be discussed.

For any parishioners who might be unable to attend in person, there is also an option to be heard via email by writing to Msgr. Fell at JFELL@DIOMETUCHEN.ORG no later than March 23. If you choose this option, please reflect on the following points: the nature and current status of St. Joseph Parish and its ministries; the qualities you feel would be most needed by the new pastor; the most salient features of the parish that the new pastor should be aware of; what you are most proud of at your parish, and the most pressing needs that you think the new pastor must be able to address in the short term.

All parishioners are asked to pray that the Holy Spirit may guide and illumine this process and are encouraged to participate in person or by email to help the diocese more fully understand the status and needs of the entire St. Joseph Parish Family. Thank you for your kind assistance in this important matter.
