FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

As I mentioned last week in this space the <u>Solemnity of the Ascension of the</u> <u>Lord</u> is now permanently transferred to the 7th Sunday of Easter in the Province of Newark (i.e. all the dioceses in the

state of NJ). This transfer is in keeping with others we have already done, like moving Corpus Christi to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday instead of it being on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. We also moved the Epiphany from January 6 to the Sunday which falls between January 1 & 6.

We have also, at times, made other changes to the liturgical calendar. Some of these changes happen on a diocesan level; some on a provincial level; some on a national level and some are universally done in the whole Church. One example of a change on a national level is how there are certain holy days of obligation which, when they fall on a Saturday or a Monday, the obligation is dispensed that year. Some holy days—like Christmas or the Immaculate Conception—are considered too important so they always get celebrated. But for others we get a pass when they fall near a Sunday -OR- we have decided to move them TO a Sunday in order to celebrate them more easily.

Why has this happened? The answer is simple: it's because of all of **YOU**.

For some reason, Catholics in America find it to be the most horrible and inconvenient thing on earth to have to attend Mass more than once in the week. So, with increasing frequency they have just not shown up for holy days of obligation. The problem there is that when you just choose to blow off a holy day of obligation you incur a mortal sin. That means that you can't receive Communion properly until you go to Confession. If you do, then you are committing another mortal sin, through receiving a sacrilegious Communion.

So, the Bishops of this country decided that in the case of most holy days of obligation (except the two I mentioned) we will be dispensed from the obligation when those days fall on a Saturday or a Monday. In addition, they decided to move some holy days of obligation, like the Epiphany and now in New Jersey, the Ascension, to a Sunday to spare everyone the horrible inconvenience of having to give the Lord a second hour in the same week. The decision was made to prevent people from committing sacrilege and also from incurring another mortal sin.

So, for those of you who don't like that we have moved the Solemnity of the Ascension from a Thursday to a Sunday, please don't blame the Bishops. If you want to know who to blame...look around you.

Despite my chiding you a bit my prayers are that all of you will have a blessed week filled with good things. None of us are perfect but the Lord is still good to us. Remember above all things this week to **Keep The Faith!**
