BISHOP'S APPEAL

Our Bishop's Annual Appeal Goal this year is once again \$28,000.00. So far, this year, as of May 12, our parish has pledged **\$15,392.60** which represents **54.97%** of our goal. So far there have been 83 individual donations made.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

After Fr. Guy's renewed appeal at all Masses last weekend we want to present you with an updated picture of where the Capital Campaign stands at the moment. Our goal is to raise \$600,000.00. As of May 17, 2023:

Total Pledged: \$413,199.00

Total Amount Received: \$343,877.51

Total Currently On Hand: \$221,019.51

Of the total amount we have received in donations \$40,000 was paid to Giving Trend, the company administering the Campaign for their fees. Last year \$28,000 was given to the Diocese of Metuchen to guarantee our Bishop's Annual Appeal goal for 2022. Also in the past year \$54,858.00 was spent from the Campaign funds to replace the HVAC units in the Parish Center. That expenditure was approved by the Parish Trustees and the Finance Council.

FROM THE PASTOR



Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

The <u>Solemnity of the Ascension</u> of Jesus Christ, also called Ascension Day, commemorates the Christian belief of the bodily Ascension of Jesus into Heaven. It is one of the ecumenical (shared by

multiple denominations) feasts of Christian churches, ranking with the feasts of the Lord's Passion (Good Friday) and Pentecost. Following the account in Acts 1:3 that the risen Lord appeared for forty days prior to his Ascension, the Ascension has traditionally been celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day of Easter although some parts of the Catholic Church, as well as other Christian denominations have moved the observance to the following Sunday. The day of observance varies by country in the Catholic Church and, as in the case of the USA, by ecclesiastical province within the same country.

Ascensiontide—a word you don't hear all that often in Catholic circles—refers to the period between the Solemnity of the Ascension and the Solemnity of Pentecost. The Latin terms used for the feast, *ascensio* and, occasionally, *ascensa*, signify that Christ was raised up *by his own powers*, (as opposed to Mary being assumed into heaven by God and not by her own powers) and it is from these terms that the holy day gets its name.

The Ascension is an essential part of the Paschal Mystery. Usually that Mystery is referred to as the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus and all too often leaves out the very important consummation of the whole thing: the Ascension into heaven. It was important that Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Second Person of the Holy Trinity, once again returned to the Father from whom he came.

The mission and work of the Christ—the Anointed One was to come into the world and accomplish the work of the salvation of all humanity by his own sacrifice on the cross. It was not intended that he take up residence in this world permanently. Rather, once he had risen to a new and glorified life his proper place was with God, the Father in heaven. This, too, is the path we will go: through death and into a new and glorified life in heaven. Where our Master has first gone, we who believe are also destined to follow. This truly is what we believe as Catholic Christians. Any other propositions or ideas are not of our faith.

Easter seems like a long time ago already but I hope that you are still experiencing the joy of the Easter season and that the Lord gives you many blessings in the coming week. Even though life in today's world can at times be difficult and challenging remember, above all things, to Keep The Faith!
