THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM THE PASTOR

On this first day of the month of November, we celebrate All Saints Day. On this day we celebrate the eternal reward of all the saints in Heaven, both those canonized and those unknown to us but, nevertheless, in heaven.

Tomorrow, the Church will celebrate All Souls Day, a day on which we pray for our departed loved ones. As we read in the Old Testament, prayer and atonement were made for the dead that they might be delivered from their sins.

During this Month of the Holy Souls, as the Church calls it, we are encouraged to pray for the souls in purgatory, where out of the mercy of God, final purification prepares these souls for the eternal glory of Heaven. One thing we can do is seek to gain an indulgence for a soul in purgatory. An indulgence is a way by which we access the graces flowing from the expiatory sacrifice of Christ Jesus and those members of His Body whose sacrifices are taken up in His throughout the centuries. The Church attaches indulgences to various prayers and pious practices. For example, from November 1-8, an indulgence can be gained, which must be applied to the souls in purgatory, by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead while there. I always like to visit my mother's grave during these days seeking to gain an indulgence for her soul and the souls of other departed loved ones.

Just now, a parishioner stopped in here at the office. I was able to chat with her for a few minutes before she had some Masses offered for departed loved ones. She said that she speaks very often with her father since his passing from this world several years ago; and she visits his gravesite often. Our belief in what we profess in the Creed each Sunday and Holy Day where it says: "I believe in the communion of saints" is put into practice each day of her life, filling her with both consolation and joy.

Remembering those who have gone before us in faith, praying for their souls and relying upon their intercession with God on our behalf is one of the great things that this month of November reminds us of each year.

May God bless, with eternal life, those who have gone before us and may He console and encourage us who continue our pilgrimage through life on this side of eternity so that one day, we too may be reunited with our loved ones in the joy of everlasting life!

This passage from Malachi denounces the laxity and unfaithfulness of the people and especially of the priests, who failed in their duties to God and their neighbors.

Paul reminisces about his extremely happy and successful visit with the Thessalonians. He praises them once again for their immediate and open acceptance of his message as truly the word of God.

Gospel: Matthew 23:1-12

In a strongly worded message, Jesus again rebukes the Pharisees for the hypocritical ostentation and love of honor and position. He reminds the people and the disciples that the truly greatest one is the one who serves others. He ends with the words, "Whoever exalts himself shall be humbled, but whoever humbles himself shall be exalted."
