### **FROM THE PASTOR**

At the time I was a middle school student, my parents introduced into my family, for my older sisters and myself, the recitation of the Rosary. At that time, I do not recall learning about the mysteries of the Rosary or how to meditate upon them. Instead, my focus was on saying the prayer, mainly, the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Glory Be as well as on counting on the beads.

A couple of years later, as a high school student, my parents began attending a weekly prayer meeting at our parish church where the Rosary was recited each time. I also, was invited to attend by my mother and began to learn more about the Rosary as I participated in the meetings each week. During that time, before each decade of the Rosary, someone read a short meditation on the mysteries of the Rosary. I learned that there were (at that time) fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, the Joyful mysteries, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries of the Rosary. (Later, of course, Pope Saint John Paul II added the five Luminous mysteries of the Rosary.) All of this was guite new to me, but I learned more and more each week. At one point, I was even invited to read one of the mystery meditations and henceforth began to take my turn to do so as the weeks went by. I recall, as I was just then becoming familiar with the mysteries, learning that you should meditate upon them while reciting the prayers of each decade of the Rosary. My natural approach was to try to understand each mystery, to interpret it as best as I could, relying on the insights offered by others in the group more experienced than myself. I looked for ways to apply the lessons I learned from each mystery to my own practices and life. This, at the time, was the guidance that came forth from adults around me in the group. I never thought to question it at the time. It seemed guite natural to me; and, in truth, it was indeed very beneficial for my formation in the Faith at the time.

As the years went on, even long after I no longer attended that prayer group, I continued to pray the Rosary and meditate on the mysteries as I had learned in that group. Even today, I am grateful for the time I had with them and what they taught me as a high school student. Eventually, as my knowledge of the Faith increased, my meditations became more profound. Especially when I studied in the seminary in preparation for priestly ordination did my understanding of the mysteries and their meaning and application for my life improve.

After ordination to the priesthood, as I continued the practice of praying the Rosary, my perspective and approach to meditating upon the mysteries developed even more. I had by then learned that our meditations on the mysteries of the Rosary could proceed in a more contemplative manner in which we open ourselves even more to the presence and communications of God. And so, I gradually found myself not so much making a study

of the mysteries during my meditations, not making a task out of it, but instead, simply enjoying the activities of God among His people to be found in each mystery. By way of example, I refer to the first joyful mystery of the Rosary, the Annunciation. In this mystery, which I believe we know so well, the archangel Gabriel is sent by God to the Blessed Virgin Mary to announce to her that, my the overshadowing and power of the Holy Spirit, she would become the Mother of God and give birth to a Savior for the good of all humankind. Now, so often, as I meditate upon this mystery, I simply place myself at the event by using my imagination to picture the splendor of the archangel and the joy of Mary in the presence of the Holy Spirit who brings Christ, the Son of God to her and, through her, to each and every one of us. Through this manner of meditation, I simply take joy in the presence of God at work among His people. I experience the peace of God's presence and the great hope that it brings! In this manner, rather than making a chore out of the Rosary, which can be the experience of many of our young people, I make it something that I can look forward to, a manner of praying that refreshes me and that I truly enjoy!

This month, October, is designated the month of the Holy Rosary. It's during this month, on October 7<sup>th</sup>, that the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Perhaps each parishioner and each family in our parish can consider what they can do to practice this great and treasured devotion of the Church or to deepen that devotion where already in practice.

May God shed His graces upon all of you through the recitation of the Rosary and through the intercession of Mary, Our Lady of the Rosary!
