FROM THE PASTOR

Just yesterday, I was reminded of a young lady whom I instructed in the Catholic Faith. At the time, she was engaged to be married to a young man who was raised in a Catholic family and continued to practice his Faith, attending Mass every Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation. Since she had begun attending Mass with him each Sunday, she decided that, unlike herself, she wanted her children to be raised as practicing Christians in the Catholic Church. She contacted our parish office and the matter was brought to my attention.

This young lady was not baptized at the time, had never been to any other church other than the Catholic Church and so needed a thorough instruction in the Catholic Faith, including a basic familiarity with the Sacred Scriptures. At the same time, she, being a very shy individual, did not feel comfortable preparing within our R.C.I.A. group; so, it was decided that I would instruct her privately. We arranged to meet on a weekly basis, usually after she finished work. Generally, she would come to the parish office on her way home from work, just before dinner time; although, we were always flexible with one another according to our particular schedules.

While we met in the parish office most times, occasionally I would be occupied with something else and so would instruct our parish secretary to send her over to the rectory when she arrived. Usually, I would be either busy in my woodworking shop, working on some project that needed to be finished, or, I would be preparing my dinner in the rectory kitchen on an evening when the other priests were not in for dinner.

So it was, that her instruction in the Catholic Faith would overlap with a lesson in either woodworking or cooking. Sometimes we would laugh about how she was given a lesson in the culinary arts "at no extra charge!" Or, she would insist that I could host a cooking show. In the end, she was well-prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation.

At the same time that she was being prepared to enter the Catholic Church, I had been preparing her and her fiancé for the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony. As part of that preparation, her father came to my office to fill out an affidavit attesting to her freedom to marry. On that occasion, I am pleased to say, he revealed to me that his daughter is so shy, that without my having made her feel comfortable throughout the process, that none of this would have ever happened.

Soon after that, I officiated at their wedding, attended the reception, later, went to bless their home and, even later than that, baptized their first child. Every year, even now, I still receive a Christmas card from her and her family.

So, how was I reminded recently of the experience I had with this young lady and her family? Every so often, while I'm cooking in the rectory kitchen, someone will interrupt me to discuss some parish business. While they might think that they are disturbing me, the reality is, they bring to mind joyful memories and, at the same time, help create new memories right here at Saint Joseph's.

It's these type of memories, of how we connect with one another and assist one another in connecting more fully with our Lord Jesus Christ, that we will one day bring with us into the joys of everlasting life!
