

# FROM THE PASTOR

This evening, I'll be celebrating the Mass at 6pm at St. Philip and St. James in Phillipsburg. Following the Mass, I'll head over to the former Flynn's On The Hill, now, I believe, called Main Street, for dinner and a meeting. All of this is due to a letter I received from Bishop Checchio back when I was still in High Bridge. The letter appointed me Chaplain of the Saint John Vianney Vocations Club of Warren County (formerly called the Serra Club of Warren County). Members meet on the last Wednesday of each month for 6pm Mass at St. Philip and St. James followed by dinner at a restaurant during which a meeting takes place. The purpose of this club is for its members to offer prayers for vocations. Jesus did say: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Luke 10:2).

Praying for vocations is more than just praying for young men to answer God's call to priesthood or young women and men to answer His call to religious life. It's also praying for those who are called by God to married life. We need to pray that young people enter into a truly sacramental marriage. That they understand the call to married life to mean that they, united as one flesh, are entering into a life-long covenant with Christ Jesus, our Lord! All too often nowadays, young people in our Catholic Church don't see the reason or importance for getting married in the Church. And so, we need to pray for these as well that, no matter what call God gives, whether it be to priesthood, religious life or the married state, that our young people will hear, understand and answer God's call.

The vocations club of Warren County meets in Phillipsburg, but is open to all Catholics residing in Warren County. If anyone is interested in attending a Mass and/or a meeting, please let me know. I would be happy to share a ride with anyone from our parish wishing to attend on any last Wednesday of the month. Our prayers for our young people are indeed important as Jesus pointed out. There's a great harvest of disciples out there, even among the children of married couples who are brought to the waters of baptism. These are the future members of our Church as are the priests and religious who will minister to them!

This passage from the book of Exodus enjoins all to adhere to specific religious and social laws. It urges all to act with justice and compassion towards others.

### Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10

Paul praises the Thessalonians for receiving the word of God so eagerly and totally. Word of their faithfulness has spread throughout Macedonia and Greece; they have become a model for all Christians.

### Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

Matthew recounts the incident in which a lawyer, seeking to entrap Jesus, asks, "Teacher, which commandment of the law is the greatest?" With simplicity and authority, Jesus responds that the first commandment is to love God with one's entire being; the second is to love one's neighbor as oneself.
