Dear Parishioners of Saint Joseph,

With the Lenten season rapidly approaching, it's time to be thinking about the sacrifices we will be making for Lent. Giving up something for Lent is our way of participating more fully in the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. Jesus gave up his life for love of his eternal Father and for us, in order to make us children of God our loving Father. Giving up something for Lent means for us to give up some part of our lives out of love for Jesus (including the members of his Mystical Body which is the Church) and our Father in Heaven.

Of course, in choosing the Lenten sacrifice we would like to make, it certainly should be something that we will need to do without on a regular basis. This way, our sacrifices become a part of our daily routine as the sacrifice made by Christ enables us to be united with him and his Father every day of our lives.

A number of years ago, I was out to dinner with some family members, including my cousin Jack. It was a Sunday during the Lenten season. During the course of the dinner, as the time to order dessert was approaching, my cousin Jack mentioned that he wasn't going to order dessert since he gave it up for Lent. Knowing my theology, I said to Jack, that whatever you have given up for Lent, you are permitted to have on Sundays. So I told him to go ahead and order dessert if he would like. Jack's response went something like this: "Oh no! When I give up something for Lent I go all the way with it!" There is a lesson to be learned from my cousin Jack in this instance. If he had enjoyed a dessert on that Sunday during Lent, it most probably would have made it much more difficult to resume his sacrifice on Monday. Nevertheless, the choice is yours. On Sundays and Solemnities during Lent, we are excused from our Lenten sacrifices if we would like. Solemnities that occur during the Lenten season are on March 19th, the Solemnity (or Solemn Feast Day) of Saint Joseph (our parish's patron) and on March 25th, the Solemnity of the Annunciation (when the Archangel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would conceive by the power of the Holy Spirit and so become the Mother of God).

Keep in mind that some individuals give up some habit of sin or some other habit to which they do not intend to return. In those cases where sin is being given up, it is never permissible to return to it, even, and especially on a Sunday or Solemnity. In the case a habit that is not sinful, but is nevertheless undesirable, it is certainly not advisable to return to it.

As each individual considers the sacrifice they would like to make during this Lenten season, please take into consideration your ability to follow through on your resolve. It's probably not best to try to achieve something beyond our own ability. Take into consideration your own

strengths and weaknesses. Choose something challenging but not overwhelming. And, keep in mind, it's not necessarily the difficulty of making a sacrifice that is most important, but the love for God and His people within our hearts for which reason we make the effort.

May God bless you and your families with a very blessed and grace-filled Lenten season.
