Good news for our parish is that, just last week, we entered into a contract with a vendor who will be replacing the roof on our classroom building within the next few months. Right now, we are waiting upon the manufacturer of the roofing materials. Not only will a new roof be installed, but the pitch of the roof will be altered so as to provide for better drainage. This involves the manufacturing and installation of some made-to-order steel trusses. This whole process will take a few months or so. For now, we just have to remain patient for a little while longer. After so many years of dealing with leaks, it's very encouraging now to know that light is at the end of the tunnel, so to speak.

Since we still haven't completed raising the capital needed for this project through our Capital Campaign, we are able to proceed with the roof replacement because of a short-term loan that has been granted to our parish from our diocese. In order to pay off the loan, we still need to complete our Campaign. And so, at this time, we are extending our parish's Capital Campaign so as to attain our goal, which is not only to raise a certain amount, but to restore and maintain our parish facilities which are such an essential part of the life of our parish community.

Toward this end, you will hear me speaking more on this topic over the next several weeks or so. I myself, as the pastoral leader of our beautiful parish, plan on making my own pledge commitment toward reaching our goal since I know that, as a parish community, every one of us is called to do their part!

May our parish patron, St. Joseph, a carpenter by trade, intercede for us in our efforts that God our loving Father, and His divine Son, Jesus our Lord and the Son of a carpenter during His time upon earth, may bless our efforts and help bring them to completion.
