

FROM THE PASTOR



The holiest week of the year has begun. We turn our prayers and our attention to the momentous events that brought us salvation and we, in a sense, live through them again during the beautiful liturgies of Holy Week.

I hope you will participate in as many of the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum as you can.

Please take note that there are no more scheduled Confessions now that Holy Week has begun. The next Confessions will take place on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 27</u>.

Also, please note the Holy Week schedule printed elsewhere in this bulletin. In particular take note of the fact that the Great Vigil of Easter takes place next <u>Saturday at</u> **8:00PM**. There is no 5:00 Mass on Holy Saturday! Also, there are three Masses in English on Easter Sunday at 7:30, 9:30 and 11:00. The Spanish Mass on Easter Sunday takes place at 12:30.

Allow all your worries, troubles and concerns to fall into the background this week. Place them at the foot of the Cross and allow the Lord to carry that burden for you along with the burden of your sins. Allow the mercy and grace of God to wash over you and fill you with a profound sense of the awesome power of God's love for you. Not just for all humanity in the abstract. God loves **YOU** as an individual. You are His child. He sent His Son into the world to suffer and die that **YOU** might have everlasting life.

This is the week we remember that. We go from triumph, to sorrow to immense joy all in the space of just a few days. As it all unfolds be a part of the story of salvation.

I remind you that Holy Thursday and Good Friday are not holy days of obligation but the faithful are encouraged to come to church those days if they can. Lent officially ends on the afternoon of Holy Thursday so that we can enter into the very short season of The Sacred Triduum. *However, Good Friday is a day of strict fasting and abstinence.*

As I preside over these beautiful liturgies please be aware that I will be remembering all of you and your loved ones and all your intentions in my prayers. I fervently hope that the week ahead is one that is filled with spiritual meaning for you and helps you to experience the love of Jesus Christ. May it be a week of great blessings. Above all things, remember to Keep the Faith!
